



STUDENT CONSUMER INFORMATION DISCLOSURE

The Higher Education Act of 1965 (HEA), as amended by the Higher Education Opportunity Act of 2008 (HEOA), includes many disclosure and reporting requirements for institutions participating in Title IV programs. A disclosure requirement is information that Vanguard Sentinel Adult Career and Technology Center (VSCTC) is required to distribute or make available to students (and sometimes employees). A reporting requirement is information submitted to the U.S. Department of Education or other agencies. Disclosure and reporting requirements sometimes overlap.

The following is a list of the key disclosure and/or reporting requirements, along with a description of how and when this information is distributed and where it can be found. Most of this information can be found in the current VSCTC Student Handbook.

<p>Principles of Excellence for Educational Institutions Serving Service Members, Veterans, Spouses, and Other Family Members</p>	<p>In carrying out the principles of E.O. 13607, an institution commits to provide the Shopping Sheet to veterans and service members before they decide to attend the institution.
